Synopsis

Inspired by the travels and conquests of Guilhermina Suggia, Duo Litanei interprets pieces related to the passage of the great cellist from Porto, Portugal through several European countries that made her conquer the success we recognize her today. From the composer's Fanny Mendelssohn and Clara Schumann to composers such as B. Britten, E. Carrapatoso, A. Webern and E. Grieg, on stage, the two elements of the duo share the same sensibility and devotion for chamber music, since the first notes they played together.

Synopsis

As part of Cello Express, this concert traces a route through the political history of samba, inspired by the album Samba de Guerrilha by the artist Luca Argel: a journey through time, where we meet stories and characters from the fight against racism, slavery and inequality. The concert includes the participation of the Porto Cello Festival Ensemble, which embarks on this journey through the tradition of samba and the music of Brazilian composer Heitor Villa-Lobos. The live narration takes us back to various moments and personalities from the fight against slavery and the military dictatorship in Brazil, which portrays the creation of samba, and which has in its genesis influences from the traditions of African culture brought by slaves coming from the portuguese colonies.



In a concert that brings together music by Villa-Lobos and arrangements of Brazilian popular music, the bridge between the two continents separated by an ocean is real. This interaction allows the fusion of the cello's western sonorities with Brazilian popular music almost 100 years after the writing of one of the first works, which portrays this meeting of cultures and gives the motto for the formation of the ensemble of cellos.

Synopsis

The concert of the ensemble of cellos from the various universities in the country will pay tribute to the beloved professor and cellist Paulo Gaio Lima, inspiration for countless generations of musicians and a pioneer in the creation of a motivated, united community prepared to welcome the youngest.

A concert that will bring together new emerging artists who propose to find a common language between two artistic strands – music and painting – in a moment of performance, where the two worlds touch. It will be a symbiosis



between listening and observing gesture, colour and texture, but also harmony, dynamics, rhythm and melody. This concert will include the performance of different ensembles of cellos and real time painting, one art complementing the other, in a unique moment of multidisciplinary interaction.

How does a painter imagine the harmony of music? What colour is reflected in the painting? How do you translate a musical phrase onto a canvas? And what will be the best tool to paint a melody? A bow, or a brush?

Synopsis

Duo Lusitano takes us on a journey through the Baroque period with works by the great Italian masters and Portuguese cellist João Batista Avondano. Duo Lusitano was born in mid-2019, the result of a will to perform continuous bass on the cello with the aim of complementing the respective investigations of its elements. The group focuses its work on representing, in a historical way, the common 18th-century practice of using the cello as a harmonic instrument. Through the use of historically informed instruments and bows, combined with academically developed knowledge, Duo Lusitano offers a unique experience in a concert format where historical and practical contexts are shared.

Synopsis

Duet of free improvisation between music and dance in which listening, the presence and nuances of sound are the starting point. It is an encounter between two women artists: a dancer and a cellist. An encounter between Mariana and Raquel.

The Baroque, the instrument's lifetime, the lifetime of the bodies, the melodies that appear and disappear, the silences, the pauses, the accents, the temperature, the colours, the wood, all this and much more, can be the subject of this duet. During about 40 minutes, this encounter may enter the performers' imagination, bringing to communication and sharing, a sensibility to the movement of sound that becomes body, that affects and allows itself to be affected. It is a work that happens in the while, in the present moment where we can guess that the bodies let themselves be bent, undulated, swayed. Between inclinations, arches and curves, we can follow a unique conversation between the bodies of these women. It is not a game of questions and answers, but rather a game that takes place in layers. They are poetic and free relationships between the research, life and work experience of each one. It is possibly about subterranean contents, audacity displacements, new combinations and re-significations.

Synopsis

"The Old World Blues", a dedication to the musical legacy of the first half of 20th century. The program is based on popular swing and bossa nova tunes from the 20s to the 60s, and also includes authentic tango music from pre-soviet Eastern Europe. The central idea of this concert program is nostalgia for the musical era, which has been preserved only in memories and analog recordings. "The Old World Blues" is a longing for a time when the talent, simplicity of expression and sincerity of a musician were not yet removed from the pedestal of public veneration by the ruthless censorship of the modern general consumer.

Synopsis

In a country whose longest border is demarcated by the Atlantic Ocean, the presence and influence of water as an essential element of our daily lives is indisputable. In this sense, the choice of space and the works to be performed, seeks to enable listeners to immerse themselves in an ocean of dreams and impressions of salt and sea. This concert, whose main theme will be the oceans and the consequences of climate change in their environment, will feature the musical performance of the Ensemble Porto Cello Festival. The programme includes works for twelve cellos in world premières, as well as original arrangements for the ensemble, such as C. Debussy's La Mer, and other compositions by M. Ravel and J. Klengel.
